Statement of Faith

At Olney Christian School, we admit students and families of any faith and religion. However, what we believe as a school informs what we teach and how we make decisions. Below is a summary of what we believe.

Head

Heart

- We're a community of sinners, redeemed by grace. Therefore when our students sin we are not surprised and we need to point each other towards the cross. We do believe there are consequences to sin and our expectations will be based on God's character, revealed in scripture, pointing us back to our need for a Savior and not fear and shame. This community extends beyond our classroom into our students' families.

 We believe that God's grace through Jesus Christ is life giving and essential, therefore we intend to discern where are student are spiritually and lead them to know and follow Jesus

Hands

Our hands reach out to serve and work and live in our communities. At OCS we not only want to do this as a school but teach our students and their families to do this in their lives.
